Church Tower

The repairs to the south and west facing elevations are drawing to a close and by the time you read this article, the scaffolding will have been dismantled. You should then see the expert restoration to the stonework, mortar and a newly refurbished clock face.

Construction of the church was completed in 1493 and it is in fine condition for its age. However from time to time it needs repair works to be carried out by master craftsmen and this work comes at some considerable cost. The Parochial Church Council (PCC) would like to acknowledge the support of Historic England for their grant of £25,000 that enabled us to get the project off the ground. Further thanks are due to FOLSC for the generous gift of £30,000 to see us through the project. The PCC would like to extend thanks to the Trustees, members and supporters of Friends of Long Sutton Church.

Church Re-Opening


Now that Freedom Day has arrived, the Church of England has published a paper on the way forward for our church buildings and their use for communal worship, fund raising events and for visitors in general.

Government guidelines have now reduced the restrictions placed on us due to COVID-19 protocols, but we have to be mindful as to how we look after not only ourselves but also others. In Church we will encourage visitors and congregations to continue social distancing and mask wearing in order to minimise the risk of contagion.

Leaving a Legacy to Holy Trinity Church, Long Sutton



Overview:

Firstly, we encourage all adults to make a Will, and to update it regularly. Writing a Will helps secure the future of the people that you love, and could save them significant trouble and expense in the future. A Will is the only way to ensure that your wishes are carried out after your death.

After providing for your family and loved ones, we suggest that you may wish to consider leaving money to Charity in your will – it is very tax-efficient for all concerned.

Finally, we ask you to think about Holy Trinity Church, Long Sutton as a recipient that could benefit from a legacy from you. Holy Trinity has charitable status by virtue of the Church of England.

What is a Legacy?:

A formal way of leaving money to a particular person or organisation. Legacies come in three forms:

Residual Legacy: This is how you leave a percentage of your remaining estate to charity after all other commitments have been made

Pecuniary Legacy: This is the gift of a specific amount from your estate

Specific Legacy: This is the same as a pecuniary legacy, but also includes information that you specify – eg from which bank account the money should come, or to which specific purpose it should be applied

How best to leave a Legacy to Holy Trinity Church, Long Sutton:

The most unambiguous way to maximise the benefit to the church is a *Specific Legacy*, in which you specify Holy Trinity Church, Long Sutton as the recipient, and specify the particular purpose to which your money should be applied (eg the organ, the Church Tower, or any other particular purpose for which you wish the money to be used). If you have no specific target

in mind, please specify the "Project Fund", as that will enable your gift to be applied to the current or a future project.
