LONG SUTTON QUAKERS GO WILD – to help nature Recently, anyone passing the Long Sutton Quaker Meeting House at the corner of Shute Lane and Langport Road, will have noticed that the grass is getting longer..... This is because local Quakers have decided to let their Burial Ground go "wild" to support biodiversity in our village.

Not only will wild flowers be encouraged, but the increased cover, food and general habitat for insects will also help birds and possibly other wildlife such as hedgehogs and bats. Some sections of the Burial Ground will continue to be mown to allow access to the grave markers and other areas.

Quakers plan to survey the "wild" area at the end of the year to identify the various plants, hoping to publish a list of what has been found.
