#### **FOLSC Update: Flaming June?**

These words are penned in what is shaping up to be one of the wettest Mays on record and by the 15<sup>th</sup> we have already had 91% of the expected rainfall for the entire month. The current record was set in 1967, when 131.7mm fell across the UK but let's hope this one is not broken in 2021 and that June will live up to its name and the sun will finally shine on us all. As many villagers will have seen and as mentioned last month, the tower of Holy Trinity is now partially encased in scaffolding

and the contractors hired by the PCC are already at work on initial restoration works and will be in situ for about the next 3 months. You may have spotted the FOLSC events banner, which is now proudly displayed high above the Somerset Levels. All members and those in our community who have supported our fund raisers over these many years can now feel justifiably proud of the £30,000 FOLSC have contributed towards the significant costs of this essential work. The other news we are delighted to report is after several

appeals for a volunteer Treasurer (to replace Rob Hartley who is moving with Liz to pastures new), Graham Stoddart -Stones has kindly stepped forward and has been duly co-opted as a Trustee. Whilst this gives us a short term fix it does not entirely resolve the underlying problem. A quick calculation today indicates the current Trustees have served our charity for a combined total of 75 years. Whist we have been delighted to do so, several of us are not getting any younger and now wish to hand over the reins at the end of the current year. In our community it tends to be the same small group of volunteers who step forward to help run our organisations but without new blood the continuity of FOLSC will be put at risk. So, if you are a new or old resident, we would love to welcome you as members but even better come and chat to David Aitken (tel. 241335) or any of the current Trustees about joining our small friendly team and so help to put something back into the focal point of our village, whist having fun helping to raise funds for our charity!

Talking of fun, sadly our intended end of lockdown party that was scheduled for 12th June proved a step too far and has had to be cancelled due to Government restrictions. We are, however, keeping everything crossed for a Christmas party to remember on **Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> December**, when hopefully Covid issues will be behind us, so please make a note of the date now and watch out for more news in due course! And finally, many thanks to Rob and Liz for all they have both done for our village during the comparatively short time they have lived in our community and we wish them both 'Bon Voyage' and every happiness in their new home out east!

#### Village hall

No doubt parishioners will have noticed the skip by the Village Hall and may wonder what is going on inside.

Thanks to a very generous grant from Viridor Credits it has been possible for the Village Hall Committee to carry out a refurbishment of the interior of the Hall to make it not only look better but to make sure it is much 'greener'.

The old (original) heating consumed so much electricity that it required a 3 phase supply and has horrendously expensive to run. It has been replaced by a highly efficient heat pump system that runs for a fraction of the cost but also allows full air-conditioning which will preclude the need to open doors and windows when the Hall is full in the summer! The rather garish overhead tube lighting has been replaced with recessed, dimmable LED lighting with a good fire rating.

The Hall's ceiling has been totally replaced with modern plaster instead of the original taped boarding; it has been insulated to a modern standard to ensure that we consume less energy Finally the hall interior is being decorated throughout.

The kitchen and lobby floor surfaces are being replaced with a commercial standard of flooring material because the current surface is breaking up badly.

It is nearing completion and it is intended to open the Hall for business on the 24<sup>th</sup> May; some finishing work will be done shortly after that.

The Tennis Courts have been refurbished and fitted with new nets. They operate on a 'first come - first served' basis and cost £3 per hour operating on an honesty scheme. A tennis annual membership fee is being considered for unlimited play – perhaps there is a parishioner/player who may wish to start a tennis club?

Grants are being sourced to enable a refurbishment of the Children's playground which is starting to show its age. Finally, a repeated plea for any volunteers to join the group that keeps this valuable community asset running. Contact tony@ellerbeck.net
