Advance Date for your diaries; <u>D-Day, Arnhem & The Rhine – A Glider Pilot's Story</u>

Weds, November 2nd, at 6pm in the Village Hall, in aid of Holy Trinity Church

Little attention has been given in recent years to the gallant actions of the men of the Glider Pilot Regiment in the Second World War. Jonathan Walker has just edited a fascinating and vivid memoir by Robert Ashby, who piloted gliders on D-Day, at Arnhem and the Crossing of the Rhine. These were among the most daring and dangerous missions of the War and it was a miracle that Ashby survived. Out of this story Jonathan has created an action-packed talk, richly illustrated by still and movie images that will leave you in no doubt as to the heroism of these remarkable men.

Jonathan is an Honorary Fellow in War Studies at the University of Birmingham and a member of the British Commission for Military History. He has written or contributed to 10 books, and regularly contributes to TV and radio documentaries.
