Finally, stuff is starting to happen again! The long delayed FOLSC AGM took place in 'team HQ,' Holy Trinity Church, on 20th October, on a dismal damp yet strangely mild evening. Despite the conditions, we had 27 members attend as well as two non-members who are new to the village and who we are delighted to report will be signing up. The meeting heard that unless we can attract new younger membership and critically new Trustees, the continuity of our charity will be in doubt. The current long serving Trustees all agreed to stand for another term and were duly re-elected, but they cannot be expected to do so ad infinitum. Church warden Tim Creegan in his report thanked FOLSC members for their invaluable support in match funding £30K, to enable the PCC to carry out extensive restoration works to the tower, that would have simply been impossible to finance were FOLSC not on hand to help in their hour of need. FOLSC is a secular charity, and our single aim is to maintain the structure of Holy Trinity, a superb 15th century Grade 1 listed building, as the focal point of our village for our generation and the generations that follow us here. We therefore appeal again to all villagers to either become members (for a very modest cost) or to support our very social fund-raising gatherings -or ideally both!

To this end our first post lockdown event is scheduled in the Long Sutton Village Hall for Saturday 4th December. We are to be entertained by Jan McNeil, who has had a long career in the entertainment industry, including working on cruise liners and even performing at one of Sir Cliff Richard's landmark birthday celebrations.
