Keeping Our End Up

The Amateur Players of Sherborne, on their first visit to Long Sutton, certainly lived up to the title of their play, eloquently performed to a packed house on the 5th October. This was only the 3rd ever performance of this play, that was written shortly before the first lockdown in 2019.

The action was somewhat deeper than perhaps implied by the Beryl Cook imagery used on relating publicity but was all the stronger for it. Set in a dowdy sports club pavilion, with a cast of 5 lady members of a bottom of the league bowls team, who represented typical aspects of middle England. During the performance they referenced adultery, domestic violence, dementia, infant death, spitefulness, onanism (look it up!) and a hit-and-run motoring offence. Our audience enjoyed an evening of both pathos and laughter and left our village hall theatre with much to consider. In addition to having a

sometimes challenging and thoughtful night out, the event delivered a fantastic £1,100 to the FOLSC fighting fund and in doing so brings us a stage closer to assisting with funding of the urgent upgrade to the electrical system in Holy Trinity. Many thanks to our members and the wider community for turning out in such numbers and for supporting this event that concludes our 2022 season.

Whilst we have your attention, we are still looking for new Trustees to join our small team and so bring fresh ideas to take our charity into 2023 and beyond. The responsibilities are undemanding, and our meetings are always very social. This is a great way for villagers and particularly those who are new to our community, to become more involved in village life.
