Community Planting

Few now disagree that the Climate Emergency and unfolding environmental crisis is upon us and those paying attention to COP26 in Glasgow will have read about the resulting rise in both temperatures and sea levels. Planting trees and shrubs, replacing lost hedgerows and allowing scrub to develop will mitigate this to some extent while re-establishing healthy ecosystems will benefit the air we breathe and food we consume.

Individual Landowners and Community groups who are interested in planting trees and hedgerows are needed.

The Water Management project aimed at 'slowing the flow' through planting areas that are adjacent to water courses or intercept surface water runoff are eligible to apply. Trees for Water Management is funded by the Somerset Rivers Authority and the Woodland Trust. It is managed by the Environmental Charity' Reimagining the Levels 'with advice from Farmers and Wildlife Advisory Group South West (FWAGSW).

We can offer advice, free trees, shrubs, stakes and protective tubes as well as a small grant for planting and fencing if needed. We are looking for roughly a minimum of 1/2 and acre for woodland planting or a minimum of 35 metres of hedging. Involvement of local volunteers to help with planting is encouraged but not compulsory.

Schools, Village Halls, Recreation Grounds and other Community groups wishing to plant trees and/or hedgerows can also apply to Reimagining the Levels as we offer the same level of support for Community Plantings.
