These words are written the morning after Storm Eunice, a name derived from the Greek word for 'a good victory'. Possibly misnamed by the Met Office, we should at least be relieved Holy Trinity has a tower not a spire Despite the restrictions of lockdown, the demands on FOLSC do not go away. In 2021 we supported the PCC with significant financial assistance, part funding repointing works on the church tower. We are now advised, in order that the church insurance can be renewed, much of the ageing wiring needs upgrading and whilst estimates are currently awaited this will clearly deliver another significant bill. This is however the 'raison d'être' FOLSC was set up, but our fighting fund is already severely depleted. So, if you are not a member, we would love you to join us, and membership leaflets are available from the FOLSC noticeboard in the entrance to the Church or from any of the Trustees. In addition, we hope you can attend our Platinum Party on Saturday 28th May, the perfect start to a week of Royal celebrations!

On the wider front we are also in urgent need of new volunteers to become Trustees. Several of the current team have served for a significant number of years and are finally stepping down at year end. We now critically need new volunteers to join us and unless this situation can be resolved, the continuity of our charity going forward will be in doubt. This is not a very demanding role and is an ideal way for those new, and particularly younger members of our community, to get involved and put something back into village life.
