Nina and her 2 daughters (16 and 14) left Kyiv on the 19th of March and arrived in the UK on the 12th of April after travelling through Poland Germany and France. Nina is a pharmacist who ran her own travel business before war broke out.

If anyone has similar age daughters in the village they would love to meet them (or mums with teenage daughters). They also all need help with practising their English. The oldest is very keen to try horse riding if anyone has the time to teach.

If anyone else is already sponsoring or thinking of doing so please contact Gill, there is a network of around 15 sponsors from Curry Rivel to Charlton Mackrell who can offer support and share experiences. A Ukrainian community hub is being set up in Somerton.
